*Title - How Can EDID Address the Erasure of Women Scholars? An Interactive Workshop*

We propose a workshop that would examine the role of erasure in academia and how EDID work might address it. It is well known that women have been erased in academia for many reasons, including the Matilda Effect. Our workshop would highlight both Global South and Global North examples of erasure and silencing. We would share some of our preliminary research on academia as patriarchy. We have already many examples and different theoretical lenses to examine erasure. Our research is grounded in both intersectional and decolonial lenses. We see this workshop as a vital opportunity to address the silencing of scholars and scholarship.

The workshop will be interactive and will provide an opportunity to co-develop some EDID action ideas. The workshop will have the following format: (1) Overview of Research Scope (2) Examples and Findings (3) Discussion to Identify Erasure in the Global South, and (4) Brainstorm Tactics Together.
